The claim construction standard applied by the PTAB in AIA proceedings since 2018.

What is the *Phillips* (or district court) standard?

The claim construction standard applied by the PTAB in ex parte appeals.

What is the broadest reasonable interpretation?

NAME OF THE GAME IS THE CLAIM - \$600 Under this doctrine of claim construction, the presence of a dependent claim that adds a particular limitation raises a presumption that the limitation in question is not found in the independent claim.

What is claim differentiation?

This is the briefing tool that parties may use in an AIA proceeding to explain what the party believes a claim term means.



What is a claim chart?

When limitations in the body of a claim rely on and derive this from the preamble, the Federal Circuit has stated that the preamble may act as this necessary component of the claimed invention.

What is antecedent basis?

Participation without registration.



What is a motion for *pro hac vice* admission?



This "removing" motion is needed to preserve any objections to evidence from the preliminary stages of the proceeding.

What is a motion to exclude?

Plus one to the party!

What is a motion for joinder?

The Constitution has 27 of these, and at PTAB you may get some to your patent claims by motion.



What are amendments?

The third clause of Netflix's Squid Games requires a majority of participants to vote to end the game. At PTAB, this motion requires all parties to agree to end the proceeding.

What is a joint motion to terminate?

The number of standard operating procedures (SOP) that govern the Board?

What is three?

A document that sets forth the typical steps performed to complete a routine process at the Board, such as the assignment of panels and designation of precedent.

What is a standard operating procedure (SOP)?

It is the SOP that governs how judges are assigned to panels.



What is SOP 1?

It is the SOP that governs how cases remanded from the Federal Circuit and handled by the PTAB.



What is SOP 9?

It is the SOP that explains how the POP process works, as well as how PTAB decisions are designated precedential or informative.

What is SOP 2?

Since the America Invents Act created the PTAB in 2012, the number of cases that the Supreme Court has decided involving PTAB issues.

What is 6?

PTAB administrative patent judges previously carried this title.

What is examiner-in-chief?

The year that appeals from an examiner's rejection first became available and, in turn, the year the first Board of Examiners was formed.

What is 1836?

In 1984, the Board of Appeals merged with the Board of Interferences to form this entity.



What is the Board of Patent Appeals and Interferences (BPAI)?



The year the first woman was appointed to serve at the Board.



What is 1971?
